#### **NAPLAN**

Students in Years 3 and 5 undertook the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy, to assess the literacy and numeracy learning of students in all Australian schools. The results of the tests will provide information to the School about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement at the end of Term 3. Each child's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.



#### **Chess Competition**

Congratulations to our fantastic chess club players. They had a terrific day stretching their brains and learning new skills at the Primary Schools' Chess tournament held in Armidale. Year 5 and 6 students also completed the Olympiad and worked in small teams to discuss and collaborate on the solutions



### **Maths Investigation**

Year 3/4 are undertaking a maths investigation where they are studying the Mathematics of their bicycles. The children are to investigate these concepts and to record their findings using efficient problem solving and recording strategies. Some wonderful maths language and cooperation between classmates has been taking place as we begin our investigations.

#### St John's Music News - Eisteddfod Success!!!

St John's has had outstanding success in the choral events of the 2015 Armidale Eisteddfod winning first place in their division of both the unison and 2 part events. The adjudicator, Gordon Hamilton who conducts one of Australia's most celebrated choirs, The Australian Voices, commented on their excellent intonation, dynamics and diction. The students were very excited about their achievement and their performances were a great testament to the St John's music programme.

The K-2 choir also performed on Tuesday in the non-competitive section of the eisteddfod. They sang 'Gecko' and 'Seeing Things at Night'. I think they had a lot of fun and the audience thoroughly enjoyed their singing.

The Vocal Ensemble is a small group this year with just 6 members but, in spite of their size, they make a beautiful sound and impressed many with their performances last week. They are to be congratulated on their 3rd place in the vocal ensemble event especially as they were competing against some much larger ensembles.

One of the lesser known events at the eisteddfod is the composition section. Students submit an original music composition for any instrument or ensemble at the conclusion of Term 1 and these are judged by an Australian composer. Three finalists are chosen from each age group and invited to perform at the composition night. Following the performances the final placings are announced. I was very excited to hear that Eloise Gooch from Year 4 was a finalist in the K-6 section of this event. Eloise performed her piano composition, 'Chase', on Wednesday evening and was delighted to receive 2nd prize. Her award included a framed excerpt from a work by Australian composer and music educator Mike Irik. Congratulations Eloise!

And now we turn our attention to 'The Three Little Pigs' our St John's musical for 2015. Auditions for this musical adaptation of Roald Dahl's revolting rhyme will be held later in the term. Stage 3 students have received a copy of the script so they can begin to make their preparations. Rehearsals will take place in term 3 during choir lessons, with extra rehearsals for main characters one afternoon per week. This will probably be either Monday or Friday afternoon from 3.30-4.30pm.
