STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics)

St John's has made sure that 2015 has been a big year for STEM activities.

Thanks to the P&F, St John's were able to purchase Primary Connections Science units for each classroom. This has ensured that staff is well resourced to present Science units that are practical and engaging for our students. What is Primary Connections?

Primary Connections: Linking science with literacy is an innovative approach to teaching and learning which aims to enhance primary school teachers' confidence and competence for teaching science.

Transition explored 'How far can a frog jump?' and received an equal second place in the Kindergarten category.







Year 3/4 investigated the Maths that can be found in a bicycle and their Merit award winning entry was titled 'The Wheel Thing.' We are so proud of the efforts of the students and staff of these classes. The competition was against major Sydney schools and this was St John's first attempt to enter this prestigious competition.

Congratulations to Owen and Sidney Rice for their participation in the Mathematics Challenge for Young Australians Stage Challenge. Both students received a Merit for their performance in this extremely demanding competition.

Year 4, 5 and 6 have been working to develop their mathematical skills by working in teams and individually on the Mathematics Olympiad competition run by Australasian Problem Solving Mathematical Olympiads (Apsmo) Inc. The students have one more Olympiad to go! It has been hard work but all students are showing improvement in their persistence and creativity when confronted by challenging problems.

As you can see, St John's has certainly made an effort to highlight STEM in 2015!



These would make great Christmas presents for family members.






FUNDRAISING CATALOGUES



STEM Day 2015

On Monday 24th August, students from years K-12 were fortunate enough to have a visit from Ben Britton and some of his 'friends' from Wild Animal Encounters to help us celebrate National Science Week. Ben is the Australian face of Nat Geo Wild TV and regularly appears on the Nine network. His objective is to promote conservation through education. What better way of achieving this than by creating an interactive experience where the plight of many endangered animals becomes relevant and personal for those in attendance. In discussions with students after the workshops, it is apparent that his mission was indeed accomplished, with testimonials such as 'it was inspiring and informative' and 'it really opened our eyes to issues of conservation'.

Of course, it wasn't all work and no play! Students learn best when they are engaged and relaxed and both Ben and his assistant Jess certainly achieved both, with their audience hanging on their every word. Students were able to interact with a Bearded Dragon, Elongated Tortoises, Corn Snakes and a lucky few even came up close and personal with a Blue Tongue Lizard's blue tongue!! Students were also very fortunate to be able to see Bubba the Green Iguana. His presence sparked many debates - was he real or plastic?? He had a very good poker face! Another favourite was Jackson the American Alligator, who some students had the opportunity to meet and greet.



The highlight of each workshop was Bethany the Red-Tailed Boa Constrictor. Weighing in at 10kg and approximately 2½ metres in length, she is an impressive animal and some were lucky enough to experience her power firsthand. Hopefully all students left the workshops with a new found appreciation for reptiles in particular and I know

that for some, it was an important step in overcoming a lifelong fear of snakes. Thanks to the team from Wild Animal Encounters for making the trip to Armidale just to come and speak to our students. It was a rewarding experience for all concerned.

Road repair work on the New England Highway, south of Uralla, from Monday 31 August to Friday 2 October 2015

The NSW Government is funding this repair work on a 1.2km section of the New England Highway, about 3km south of Uralla at Waterworks Road, to provide a stronger, longer lasting and safer road.

Roads and Maritime Services will carry out the work, which will involve the placement and compaction of new material on the highway before applying a reseal, between Staces and Hillcrest roads. The work, which will also include linemarking, will improve the road surface.

We will be working Monday to Friday between 6am and 6pm and Saturdays between 7am and 1pm and expect to complete the project in five weeks, weather permitting.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise associated with this work. We will make every effort to minimise noise by limiting work hours.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. Traffic flow will be reduced to one lane during work hours and an escort vehicle will be in use to ensure the safety of road users and workers. Waterworks and Hillcrest roads will remain open for access at the intersections with the New England Highway.

The traffic changes during work hours may cause delays of up to 15 minutes. Please allow extra travel time, keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

Up to date information, including any date changes and detours, will be displayed on electronic message signs along the road.
