New buses for seatbelt replacement programme starting in Term 2

As part of the new requirements for all school buses that transport students beyond the town limits, Edwards' Coaches has upgraded the buses on the following routes:

- Warrane Longford
- Rockvale

- Invergowrie 1 & 2

Students must be aware that if a bus has seatbelts, they are required to wear them. Failure to wear a seatbelt will result in the following consequences:

- Students will be reminded of these protocols by the bus driver and will be warned if they fail to comply.

- First offence: parents and school principal notified in writing; student counselled accordingly.

- Subsequent offences: parents and school principal notified; student not able to travel on the bus for up to 2 weeks for a second offence and up to 10 weeks for any subsequent offence. Permanent suspension of travel may apply to further offences.


Senior students are asked to be of assistance to junior students who may struggle to do up and undo the seatbelt. All buses will be upgraded in the coming years.

What's new

From 12 May 2016, applications for school travel passes in rural and regional NSW will need to be completed online instead of using paper forms.

This change makes it easier to apply, as you only need to complete one form that covers all situations, including journeys that involve multiple transport operators or modes of transport. It's also easier for schools and bus operators, as Transport for NSW will now handle the applications. This change only affects the application process; no changes to any public transport services are planned.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a school travel pass, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants) There's no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary) 2.0km straight line distance or 2.9km walking.

Who needs to apply

Most students who already have a school travel pass in 2016 won't need to re-apply for next year.

However, you need to update student details online if the student:

- Is moving from Year 2 to Year 3
 - Is moving from Year 6 to Year 7
- Is changing schools or campuses
 - Is changing address

How to update your details

If the student already has a school travel pass and their address, school or name changes, or the student is entering Years 3 or 7, you will need to update your details at

apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updatedetails.

How to apply for a new travel pass

Applications for 2017 open from the start of Term 4, 2016.

Step 1

Once you have confirmed your 2017 school enrolment, complete the online application form at **transportnsw.info/school-students**, nominating your home address and which bus company or transport operator the student needs to travel between home and school.

Step 2

Print, sign and date the completed application, then return it to the student's school for endorsement.

Step 3

The school then sends the endorsed application to Transport for NSW. You will receive an email confirming the outcome of your application. If the application is approved, Transport for NSW will inform your local bus or transport operator who will send a school travel pass to the student's school, or in some cases, to the student's address.

A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over must apply for themselves.

Frequently asked questions

Can I still apply using a paper form?

Carbon copy forms are no longer being accepted after Term 2, 2016. To download a paper form visit **apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts**.

How can I apply if I don't have internet access?

Call 131 500 for assistance with your application.

ls a school travel pass valid outside school hours? School travel passes are only for travel to and from school. So for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays, students will need to purchase a ticket.

What if there's no public transport in my area? In areas where there is no public transport, eligible NSW residents may receive a subsidy for transporting the student to school by private vehicle. For details visit **transportnsw.info/school-students**.

How do I apply if the student is in a shared parenting situation and needs to travel from two addresses?

Each parent (or the student if aged 16 or over) needs to make a separate application for each address. The same eligibility criteria apply.

Year 8 Maths Day

The only way to succeed in this challenge was by working as a team. It is fair to say that both NEGS' teams did phenomenally well.

After all the mathematics events were finished it was time for the Architectural Design Challenge. Each team was given 15 pieces of paper and a roll of sticky tape and asked to build the tallest tower that they could. It got a little chaotic. After a hectic half hour the challenge finished and the towers were measured. I am pleased to say that NEGS Team One came first in the challenge with a tower measuring 2.41 metres tall.

On behalf of all of the students that attended this day I would like to thank our supervisors Ms Despi and Ms Edmonds. Without them we would not have been provided with the opportunity to attend this event. We all learnt so much about maths and teamwork. I would also like to thank the University of New England for organising and hosting the day. It was a truly remarkable experience.

Science News

This year we welcomed a new addition to Miss Stone's Biology Lab - Cuddles is a juvenile Diamond Python who has made herself right at home. When she's not chilling out on her log, she is captivating students as she engulfs her dinner whole or enthralling them with her abs of steel! Look out for Miss Stone when walking around the school grounds, as Cuddles might just be out catching some rays!

Our students have once again excelled in the competitions they have entered so far this year. Our 10A Science class came 3rd in the Highlands Science & Engineering Challenge, showing off their teamwork in a fabulous day of bridge building, hovercraft designing and earthquake tower proofing, to name a few of the activities.

Our Science Club girls participated in the BEBRAS computational thinking challenge, achieving excellent results, and are currently growing pulse crops for the Young Scientist Awards and Hermitage Schools Plant Science competition. By the end of this year, they will have also competed in the Eureka Science Prizes, Science iQonline competition, the Education Perfect World Championships and UNE's GRASS awards.

Our Coding Club students have also been busy learning how to design web pages and program computers using the Python language. They competed in a national HTML/CSS competition, achieving outstanding results, and are currently competing in a Python programming competition. They are also designing computer games for the national STEM Video Game challenge.

All Science students from Years 7-12 will compete in the national Big Science competition in May and Year 11 and 12 Chemistry students will also compete in the national RACI Titration competition.

The Science faculty is always an engaging place to be. So far this year, students have constructed boomerangs, dissected eyes and brains, raced remote controlled cars, had a 'shocking' experience with the Van de Graaf Generator, broken the NEGS sound barrier and designed aliens, just to name a few of the activities covered!
