From the Principal

As the School paid homage to the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended fighting in the First World War during Assembly last week, we all reflected upon what that actually means. To generations who simply cannot fathom the indomitable sacrifice made by our forefathers, we were sobered by the Australian statistics for WW1: 60 000 deaths; 156 000 wounded, gassed or taken prisoner; casualty rate was 65%, one of the highest; 1.8 million horses and pack animals killed; 130 000 Walers exported with 1 brought home. Finally, after the Great War, 50 million people worldwide died from the Spanish Influenza. Mr David Rose and the Yr 12 Modern History students did a wonderful job in this presentation.

Whilst I ordinarily do not like to mention individual sporting successes in my editorial, sometimes there is such a level of accomplishment that it is befitting to mention it in this space. As such, I would like to acknowledge Gemma Stuart Year 9. Gemma was selected to play Polocrosse in a Barbarian Under 16's team, competing in South Africa in August 2018. At this International Tournament, Gemma was awarded the best female player of the series, which meant that Gemma was the best junior female player in the world at this time. To show that this was not a one-off, Gemma continued her winning ways by representing NSW in the Australian National Polocrosse Championships held in Perth in October 2018. With her teammate and fellow NEGS student, Abby Finlayson, the NSW Junior Team won every game they played finally being crowned overall winners of the tournament. Individually, Gemma was named Best Number 3 - Junior Girl player; Best Junior Girl - Australian Stock Horse; Best Junior Girl - horse and rider combination; and Best Overall Junior at the Perth 2018 Polocrosse Nationals

This was selected between both the junior boys and girls, making Gemma the best junior in Australia. This is simply an outstanding achievement by Gemma. Congratulations.

I think you will all agree, Mr Ashman will be another positive addition to the already outstanding NEGS team.



# **DEAR NSW BOARDING FAMILIES**

Remember that a trip can only be recorded when your child is in the car with you. If you have no idea what I am talking about, please read this information:

School Drive Subsidy (replacing Private Vehicle Conveyancing Subsidy)

The School Drive Subsidy is available to NSW residents in areas where there is no public transport, to drive an eligible student all or part of the way to school. The subsidy is only intended to partly offset the cost of using a private vehicle to drive the eligible student and is not intended to cover all costs. Transport for NSW administers the School Drive Subsidy scheme. The subsidy is for driving school students to school or to the nearest transport pick up point, by car, motorcycle or boat.

Also this year for our Activity day K-6 will be heading to the movies to see 'Grinch' (G) and then return for an afternoon with the Year 6 students running a haunted house and face painting.

We are constantly talking about the 21st century digital revolution which is described as a global revolution. All of this is certainly true and our young people are growing up in an entirely different era to their parents, and technology has created vast opportunities for all of us. However at a recent Junior School Headmaster's meeting in Sydney I listened to the pitfalls that can be encountered and I gathered the following advice which I would like to take the liberty to pass on to you. Parents can't let their young person/s loose in the digital world without having several conversations about how to stay safe online, how to show respectful behaviour and be aware of the pitfalls. Certainly we at NEGS Junior School make our students constantly aware of the pitfalls of this educational digital era, however we advise parents to also speak to your child (obviously in an age related way) and talk about respectful relationships, safety and cyber-pornography. Each of these topics is a separate issue on its own, but each is deeply affected by the virtual, boundary-free nature of digital technology. This kind of digital exposure can have massive ramifications on the growth and development of young people, especially when it comes to the quality of their relationships and wellbeing.

Today it does not matter if you live in a lovely natural rural environment as we do or in a crowded inner city area, the digital era covers all environments in the same

We must be prepared to personally learn: be ready to learn about social media, and the different apps and games that young people may be playing. But at the same time, be mindful of their boundaries.

Change the rules if necessary. Be prepared to keep evolving your rules based on your young person's behaviour, maturity, sleep habits, their tendency to leave homework or chores unfinished, bullying or any number of issues that will invariably crop up to make them feel like your rules just aren't working.

Keep digital devices out of the bedroom: If there was one rule that you should stay firm on, then this is the one. Keep the charger in a public place. Applaud them on wanting to wake up on their own, but don't use a tablet or mobile, get them a regular alarm clock instead.

Digital technology is now an integral part of our lives, but it's not the only option we have for entertainment, information and/or communication. Before we help our young people, it's best to look at our own digital habits to make sure we are providing them with what they need – that is, leading by example and being balanced role models who know when to use and when not to use their devices. They are far more likely to walk our walk than follow our talk.

# AS THE SCHOOL YEAR DRAWS TO A CLOSE, I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE WITH YOU SOME EXCITING NEWS.

The NEGS Junior school has experienced its highest number of enrolments in recent years and the upward trend looks to be continuing well into 2019. As a result we will be needing an additional classroom, and so our teacher Mrs Catherine McCann and her Transition students will be permanently relocating to the Saumarez building.

The new space will incorporate two spacious classrooms including the Sensory Gym joined by a breakout area and a 180m<sup>2</sup> undercover multipurpose playground.

Work will commence during the Christmas holidays where the large external area will be transformed into an outside classroom to incorporate Catherine's focus on nature, sustainability and sensory development, which is a particular passion of hers.

For those of you who might not be aware of the Sensory Gym, this has been an integral part of the NEGS Junior School allowing our students to complete circuits of vigorous gross-motor exercise designed to stimulate all senses.

Apart from the substantially larger space, the location is perfectly positioned with even greater access to the music, library, Assembly Hall, Chapel and agriculture plot. Transition students will also be able to access the MPC and new sport precinct as this will be on their doorstep.

Top of the mind in our decision process has been ensuring that the strong connection between Transition and the Junior school is maintained. 2019 will see the introduction of a buddy system with a Year 5 student assigned to a Transition student with planned weekly visits and increased engagement. Transition will join the Junior school on Fridays for their much-loved sporting activities on the oval and will always be part of all our special events.


