CAREER NEWS

The careers office continues to be very busy at this time of the year. Our Year 12 leavers are receiving early entry offers and waiting rather impatiently for the results and ATAR's to be released in mid-December. I am away at a local careers network this week to learn some more about the early entry and offer procedures, and how it will impact our leavers.

As the results come out, I hope that all girls receive the marks that they have worked hard to achieve. Remember if you don't get the mark you need there are plenty of alternative pathways into the course that you want to do. Last Saturday a friend of ours graduated as a Doctor but he did not do this straight after school as he did not get the ATAR he needed. He completed 4 years at the University of Newcastle graduating as a physiotherapist and then applied to University of Wollongong to study medicine. He has achieved his dreams but just did it by undertaking an alternate pathway.

Currently Year 10 are out and about up and down the Eastern seaboard undertaking work experience in some very varied occupations. Whilst undertaking work experience the girls complete a journal and their supervisor completes an evaluation. Both of these are returned to me to be added to the girls' files.

DEAR NSW BOARDING FAMILIES

As we head towards the end of Term 4, may I remind you to send me your travel diaries for your subsidised travel by the end of the term? These diaries are available here: <u>http://www.negs.nsw.edu.au/parents/senior-school/forms/</u> (under Boarders' Information). Remember that a trip can only be recorded when your child is in the car with you. If you have no idea what I am talking about, please read this information:

School Drive Subsidy (replacing Private Vehicle Conveyancing Subsidy)

The School Drive Subsidy is available to NSW residents in areas where there is no public transport, to drive an eligible student all or part of the way to school. The subsidy is only intended to partly offset the cost of using a private vehicle to drive the eligible student and is not intended to cover all costs. Transport for NSW administers the School Drive Subsidy scheme. The subsidy is for driving school students to school or to the nearest transport pick up point, by car, motorcycle or boat.

Reading your child's school report. Reports can mean anxious times for children. Will my parents be disappointed or proud? This is the main concern for most children.

Student reports also bring mixed feelings for parents. Pleasure and pride if they are performing well but considerable angst when children are not progressing as they had hoped. Children of all ages take their cues from their parents, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people.

Here are some ideas to consider when you open your child's report:

- Focus on strengths. Do you look for strengths or weaknesses first? The challenge is to focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.
- Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort is below standard, then you have something to work on. If the child is putting in the required effort, then you cannot ask any more than that, regardless of the grading.
- **Broaden your focus away** to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How the child gets along with their peers will influence their happiness and wellbeing, as well as give an indicator to their future. The skills of independence and co-operation are highly valued by employers, so don't dismiss these as unimportant.
- Take note of student self- assessment. Children are generally very honest and will give a realistic assessment of their progress. They are usually very perceptive so take note of their opinions.
- **Discuss the report with your child**, talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask their opinion about how they performed and discuss what might concern them.
- After reports are read and discussed, celebrate their efforts with a special activity or treat. In this way you will recognise progress and also remind them that the holidays are just around the corner, where they can forget about assessments, tests and reports for a while.

The Semester Two reports will be handed out at the Celebration of Learning, I hope the above helps you enjoy reading about your child's progress over the second part of this year and sharing the experience with them. Keep them reading during the holidays, books can offer the best escape for free! Happy Holidays everyone.


