From The Head of the Junior School

Dear Junior School Families,

Welcome back to an unusual start to Term 2. We would especially like to welcome our new Junior School students: Dylan, Brigitte, Kenan, George, Jonathan and Philippe.

I hope you all had a wonderful Easter and the students received my letter and chocolate in the post.

It was great to walk around the classrooms today and to see and hear all the students so excited to be back, alas, remotely online. Please remember if parents need to attend work and you don't have care for your child, we are here to help.

For the first two weeks we will continue delivering our remote learning online from 9.00am - 3.20pm, following the students' timetable to help aid parents at home and the continuing education of your students. We hope by week 3 we can start introducing student groups back to school to recommence face to face learning. As we get closer to week 3 we will notify families regarding the particular days students are to return.

For students (Transition to Year 6) who are attending over the next two weeks we ask parents to:

Only use the Junior School car park for drop off and pick up. Parents are to remain with their car and not enter the school grounds. For younger students who may need assistance there will be staff on duty to help you at the gate.

Students are to use the provided hand sanitiser at the rear gate as they enter

Students are to sanitise their hands each time they enter a building/classroom and practise safe hygiene whilst at school.

If your child shows any signs or symptoms of a cold or flu they will not be allowed at school. We ask parents to be contactable throughout the day in case your child becomes sick and needs to be picked up ASAP.

We cannot wait to have you all back on our beautiful school grounds.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Thank you to all of our students, parents and staff for your continued support with our remote learning model during the Covid 19 pandemic. As announced by the NSW Premier Ms Berejiklian last week, she stated that "health advice continues to be that schools remain open, and parents, teachers and students can be confident that school is a safe place". We continue to closely follow the advice from all relevant government authorities.

With that in mind, Term 2 Weeks 1 & 2 will be delivered remotely to our school community as it was in the last two weeks of Term 1 that is: those students who can, will learn remotely from home, however the School will remain open for students who need to attend.

As per the NSW Government announcement, from Week 3, May 11 onwards, there will be an easing of restrictions and all senior day school students will be able to attend the NEGS campus full-time. At the moment, we advise that the Dining Hall will remain closed.

Junior School students shall be rotated to attend the Junior School campus. Next week more information will be sent to Junior School families about which days students will receive their face to face learning.

The return of boarding students will be addressed later in the term. As you can appreciate, this is a continually fluid situation and as more information comes to hand, we will notify you as soon as possible of any affect this will have on you and your child.

It is important to note that all lessons will still be online to ensure equality of delivery for all students. A huge thank you to our teachers who have worked tirelessly over the holidays to prepare to deliver online learning.
