NEGS Sporting Complex

We are very excited to announce that work on the sporting complex will resume in the coming weeks. We are aiming that, all things considered, this complex will be completed by Spring 2020 and will be using local businesses where we can to bring more work into the local community.

This Sporting Complex will be among the best multi-sport venues in regional Australia providing NEGS athletes a state-of-the-art facility for daily training and competition. The complex will be anchored by a state-of-the-art synthetic hockey field built to Federation of International Hockey (FIH) Standards, a rugby field, athletics track, nine netball courts and two tennis courts resurfaced with artificial turf.

This will be a truly remarkable facility and will positively impact every single student, current and future, when we deliver one of the best training and competition venues in the region. Our aim is to develop players into top-level athletes and ensure our regional players have the same opportunities as those living in metropolitan areas.

The completion of this complex will ensure Armidale can hold tournaments such as the State Hockey tournaments. We are hoping to encourage Sydney schools to visit and have already started looking at the calendar for Term 4 2020 and dates in 2021.
