Primary Music News

From Preschool to Year 6, NEGS students have enjoyed their term of music-making. Every single Junior School student has two Music lessons a fortnight with a specialist Music teacher, Ms Wright and Mrs Hughes. Kindergarten to Year 6 also attend a weekly choir session with Ms Wright, an internationally qualified choral and vocal expert.

Pre-K and Kindergarten have spent the term singing and playing percussion instruments. Years 1-2 moved on to learning the recorder, a tricky instrument to master as many families will know. Through movement and singing they learn simple but fun songs that are then transferred to the recorder. We have worked hard on good posture, playing with correct fingers and breathing well so we play without squeaks. Even other teachers say we sound good so we must be doing something right!





Years 3-4 have a Strings lesson each week with our wonderful teacher, Ms Natasha Dyason. In these lessons, each student is assigned a violin, viola or cello and learns how to play simple open-string songs. We are learning not only to play notes and rhythms on our instruments, but techniques such as *pizzicato* and *arco*, and how to play as a class ensemble. Year 3-4 Strings will perform at the Armidale Eisteddfod in May.



Year 5 have Music lessons with Ms Wright, in which we have learned how to play Orff instruments such as marimbas, xylophones and glockenspiels. We learn our songs through games and singing, and we then learn how to improvise and accompany ourselves on percussion instruments. This allows us to develop ensemble skills as well as the courage to create new tunes and to multi-task by singing and playing simultaneously.

Year 6 are working on xylophones and unpitched percussion instruments, developing their ensemble skills with Mrs Hughes. They have been learning a number of songs and are now starting to improvise, which is amazing! They are gaining more and more confidence and coming up with beautiful melodies.

Our co-curricular ensembles, Songbirds and Saumarez Strings, are also looking forward to performing at the Armidale Eisteddfod in May and June. Any student from K-6 who sings is invited to join Songbirds next term, rehearsing Wednesdays at 8am with Ms Wright. All string enthusiasts are similarly welcome at Saumarez Strings with Ms Dyason on Mondays (rehearsal time is TBC).



We hope all Junior School students have a relaxing break so they're ready for another busy term of music making!

Is your child interested in playing an instrument?

At NEGS, we offer individual instrumental and voice lessons to suit beginners through to advanced learners. Our visiting music tutors teach in the Forster Music Building, in our specialised teaching studios and learning spaces. NEGS students perform regularly at school events, external community events and the Armidale Eisteddfod. Most of the instrumental teachers are employed through NECOM (New England Conservatorium of Music). All of our tutors are highly qualified in their area and have extensive experience in teaching young people.



If your child is interested in learning an instrument, please follow these steps:

- 1) Discuss with your child which instrument they would like to learn (see the list below).
- 2) If your child's chosen instrument is taught by a NECOM tutor, please complete the <u>NECOM</u> <u>Enrolment Form</u> at your earliest convenience. Lessons cannot commence without this.
- 3) If your child's chosen instrument is piano/organ or voice, you may contact Mr Peter Sanders or Ms Hester Wright directly, via the email addresses provided below.
- 4) Your tutor will advise the NEGS Music Department upon commencement of your child's lessons.
- 5) NEGS Music Department will assist tutors in the timetabling of lessons where required. Students will be notified of their lesson time by their tutor and all tutor timetables will be displayed on the noticeboard in the Music Department.
- 6) Either NECOM or your tutor will invoice you directly for their services.
- 7) Please purchase any books or equipment recommended by your tutor prior to commencing lessons. A NEGS Music Diary will be supplied to your tutor.
- 8) Should you like to hire an instrument from NEGS, please fill out the instrumental hire form.
